Alternatives for Sustainable Economic Growth in the OxCam Arc

The communities and businesses that comprise the OxCam Arc represent some of the greatest potential for sustainable economic growth in the United Kingdom. Internationally recognised academic centres have attracted global capital and talent to nurture the next generation of leading businesses.

Government policies to nurture sustainable growth need to be flexible to keep pace with innovation, to promote our global competitiveness, and to maintain the support of residents both new and long standing.

As a cross party group of Members of Parliament representing constituencies across the OxCam Arc, we are fully aware of the potential for sustainable growth and of the rapid changes already underway locally to secure that growth.

To date, the driving force for sustainable economic growth has been the 2016 National Infrastructure Commission Report but we believe that this approach needs a review and that alternatives should be considered.

Specifically, the 2016 Report is now falling short because:

- The Expressway does not traverse Buckinghamshire
- The business case for East West Rail has substantial difficulties
- The "one million" homes target has been dropped by the Government
- Environmental expectations have risen calling into question major infrastructure initiatives and the nature of future housebuilding
- Faster adoption of technology during COVID has changed work and travel patterns
- Local support has been lost due to poor communication, execution or from rising pressure on local services
